

Favourite Bible Characters and Stories Unlock walk workshop 2008

Workshop participants work in pairs (if there's an odd number one of the leaders can join in to make another pair).

Instructions are either projected onto a screen, (maybe with some friendly pictures), or printed out on cards (so that there are enough to give each pair a card and plenty spares to replace any that people take away with them). If cards are used you don't even need to arrange to have a laptop and projector set up.

In your pairs, take turns to spend 5 minutes telling your partner about your favourite Bible character, or story (not Jesus). Tell them why that character or story means something for you. Choose a word, an image or make a model to expresses what that character or story means for you.

Optional extra activity - use the resources provided to add your word or image to the display. You need to indicate which Bible character or story it refers to. You can add your own name and your church too if you like, so we have a record of walkers passing through and participating.

Provide a modest range of creative resources; cutting and sticking stuff, magazines, coloured pens, some small boxes and yoghurt pots, wool etc. We put up some backing paper on which to display people's contributions. If you like you can arrange the contributions in Biblical order along the paper to create a big narrative collage.
