

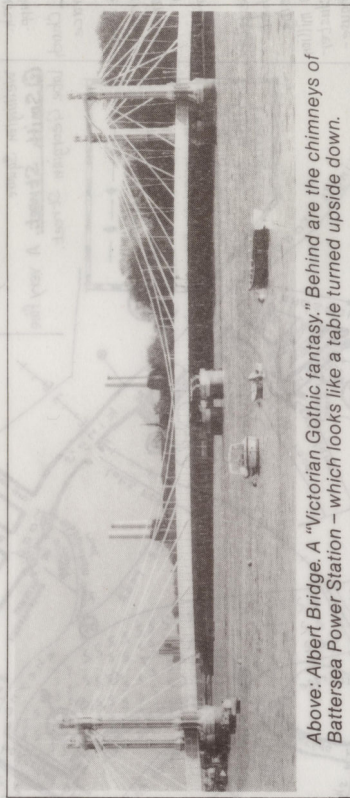

Our Walks have been a tremendous success as these figures show:-

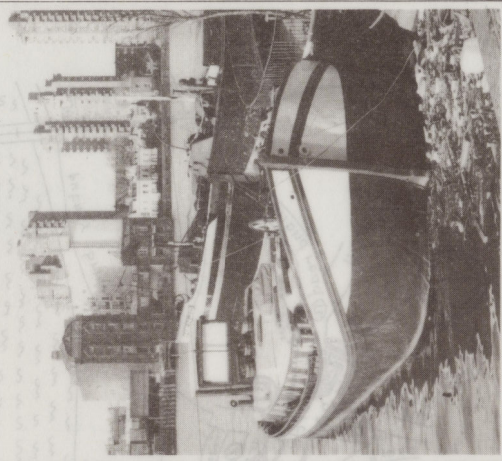

is non-denominational and specialises in helping Christians relate the Gospel to people of average or below average literacy - people who "can read but don't." Our resources are an energetic National Council, a widening network of volunteers and one fulltime Project Officer - Jim Hart. During his 4 years Jim has run 60 courses involving 1,650 people. More than 600 D.I.Y. course-kits have been sold. Our imaginative exercises "Parish Audit - Switching the Style" have been received with enthusiasm (and are of use to all churches, not just Anglican).
