read and apply it. Unlock is about:

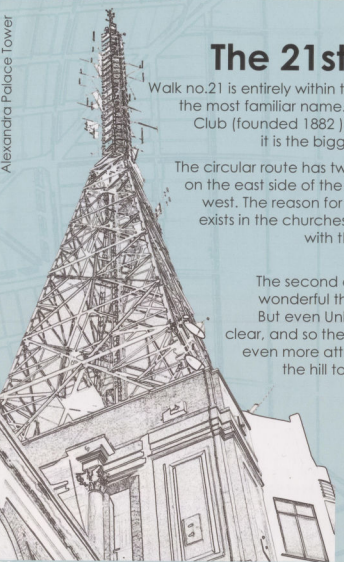

The 21st Unlock Sponsored Walk

Walk no.21 is entirely within the Borough of Haringey, within which Tottenham is probably the most familiar name. The reason for that is of course Tottenham Hotspur Football Club (founded 1882), which is east of our route, and we are avoiding it because it is the biggest day of the year when local rivals Arsenal are the visitors!

The circular route has two oddities: the first is to do with the churches, which cluster on the east side of the railway line which divides our walk, leaving only one on the west. The reason for this is the remarkably close fellowship, quite informal, which exists in the churches of Tottenham, holding together the historic denominations with the new, often Pentecostal, churches. We must reflect this in the churches we visit.

The second oddity is the choice of route at Alexandra Palace. The most wonderful thing about the Palace is the stunning view from the terrace. But even Unlock cannot guarantee more than 50% that the day will be clear, and so there is an alternative short-cut on foot if it is murky, or perhaps even more attractive, a bus trip past the Palace. In any weather a bus up the hill to the Palace either way and a walk down is wise, except for the strong and the bold!

The Palace and Peacemakers walk is probably the most remarkable example, in all our 21 years, of churches working and praying together, and cooperating with secular bodies. The result is to touch the whole community around them in deeply healing and life-giving ways.

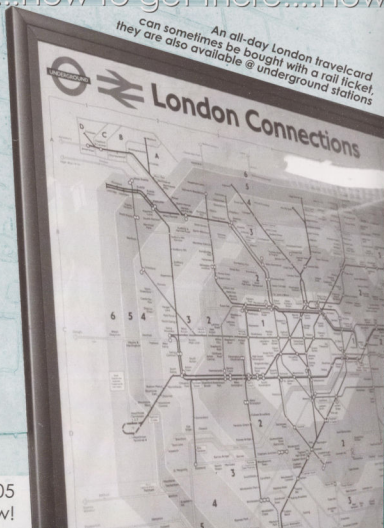
Convenient access points by rail:

1. Harringay, Finsbury Park, Alexandra Palace and Hornsey stations can all be reached via London Moorgate
 2. Finsbury Park can also be reached from London King's Cross
 3. Bruce Grove, South Tottenham and Seven Sisters can be reached via Liverpool Street
- By tube:**
1. Piccadilly Line to Turnpike Lane or Wood Green
 2. Victoria Line to Seven Sisters or Finsbury Park
