Unlock's origins

Unlock was founded in 1972 by a group of Christian leaders & ministers who shared a concern for the people of Britain's inner cities. Unlock was 50 years old in 2022!

Jesus does not exclude anyone from growing in their Christian faith simply because the way that they take in information, think, or learn, is different to the ways in which the **Church has always** done these things.



Jesus does not exclude anyone from the Church or

the Kingdom because they are 'not the right kind of people'.





Jesus does not make anyone feel that they are beyond the reach of God's **Grace because** they are 'not posh enough'.



Jesus does not want anyone to feel excluded from church life because they do not have the *right qualifications*, or the *right kind of job*, or live in the *right kind of* house, or street, or read III SI U the right books, or have the right way of speaking.



- The fact that no one ever *meant* to make people feel that way does not mean that it has not happened.
- The church needs to be prepared to *listen attentively to those who have felt marginalized or excluded.*





BELIEVE Those who the church has somehow kept at the edge are often those from whom we have most to learn.

Seaham Gets Creative with Sea Glass!

Gemma came to an Unlock Training event in Sunderland last Autumn. As part of the day Gemma and her colleagues had fun planning an Unlock session along these lines.

The group started by identifying something that was special to the story of their community. Seaham was home to one of the biggest bottle manufacturers in Europe between 1850 and 1932. At the end of each day the waste glass was simply tipped onto the beach. So, Seaham beach is famous for the quantities of sea glass that can be found there. The group used the idea of the sea glass to create this Unlock workshop outline.

You are chosen by God, you are loved.

Search out pieces of sea glass from a tray of sand. Find ones that you like and say why they appeal to you. Use this activity to encourage people to share something of themselves and their stories.

Seaham sea glass is something that has been thrown away as rubbish but it is still beautiful and can be used to make beautiful things.

Watch a clip from 'The Chosen' – Jesus choosing his Disciples or Zacchaeus.

Song - God has chosen me?

Continue a discussion of being chosen while making or doing something using sea glass – mobiles, mosaic hearts, light catchers, pictures, decorate jam jars with sea glass.

Feeding & Being Fed.

Donna; a struggling young mum attended an Unlock session about food: two days later, she rushed into lunch club, still really excited about what she had learned, shouting out; 'five loaves & fishes & 12 baskets... 12 BASKETS leftover!!!!' Donna tells her daughter that she wants a Bible; there was a child like wonder in her response to the session; it connects to her own experience

of feeding & being fed. She likes to have her freezer and cupboards full and feed her children on demand. Her sister is there too; they were giving each-other permission. They are filled with wonder at a super-abundant God.





Things People have said . . .

'Unlock are specifically committed to a section of society that the church often neglects, because that section of society is perceived as not having the intellectual capacity to engage adequately with the Bible, which is often regarded in the church as a text for experts. Unlock reaches out specifically to a marginalized

group and in doing so, Unlock follows the example of Jesus.'



STUFF HAPPENS

STOP!

Using the 'say it how it is' 2 Kings session (Mess & Mistakes & Muddling through): Jane's boyfriend bought a van, she's lent him some money; she is uncomfortable, feels trapped. In the session she came across the stop sign. She heard about God saying that he was not happy with the way people were behaving. It was an entirely new concept. It had never occurred to her before that she had both the right and the power to simply say 'No'. On the Friday she came, in and said, 'I've done it! Got the money back ST(and never saw him again'. The power to say 'No' became new a feature of her life; she's since made other choices on that basis.

STUFF REALLY HAPPENS!

Family.

A mum & 3 grown up daughters; very local; attended toddlers and messy church. First they all joined in with Unlock - Surviving Xmas, then 'New Year; New You'. One can't read & write; they started doing exercise (walking etc) as a result of the priorities session, one of them acting as a local leader. Now there is a family exercise group. Then the Minister continues the group as a nurture course; all four are now members of the church, full on; plus one of their male partners. Family reinforcement really helps.



During Unlock DIY, after a taster Unlock session:-

 'This is more like "with-reach" than outreach'

 'I liked that I didn't feel taught at but rather that we were Learning together'





- Unlock have understood the importance of the narrative of people's lives and how our story interacts with God's story.'
- Unlock have understood how text can paralyze and intimidate people while imagés can release people into expressing themselves and thus becoming part of a learning community.'





- "You can trust the Unlock process; you know you won't go far wrong"
- "Other things can be so cringey, but with this you just feel more confident"
- "People are less bothered about talking about the bible than we think!".





FROM AN UNLOCK WORKER . .

At the end of his time with us Cameron said this -

"I just wanted to say a huge thank you to the team at Unlock for allowing me to have an amazing year working with Unlock, I have learned and grown so much as an individual but most importantly in my faith.

I heard stories and saw emotions that were Unlocked through the events that that I held, and connected with people better through our stories. I have gained skills and knowledge but mainly memories that will be with me forever."





- "People are changing their perspectives and behaviour, to say they have some authority for that".
 For example, Toni: "I live this way now because of Jesus".
- "Our stories first: they open an emotional door". "The same story (feed5k) had gone right over Kerry's head before".







'Unlock sets out to set people free to discover God's story for themselves, rather than creating dependence on Bible 'experts'.'





'Unlock goes back to the way in which Christ taught, using stories and situations as the common

starting point, which enables a sharing, not from the power invested position of the pulpit but from a common humanity.'





For Some it offers a NEW START

Using the Unlock New beginnings session with a very mixed group, we learn that 'anyone who belongs to Christ is a new person'. Three different people who had gone all through separation & divorce; had never realized before that they could have a new start.





- Unlock helped me realise that the Bible is relevant to my life now'
- 'Unlock brings our everyday lives into conversation with the Bible'
- People's experience is a valid lens for looking at the Bible'





Things people have said . . .

Alpha just doesn't fit; **Unlock is much more** relevant to the people in our community' Starting with experience is a strength because everyone can talk about their own experience.'





1. Take concrete and regular action which clearly communicates that the day to day lives, work, and experiences of *Everyday Christians* is highly valued.

2. Find someone on the church fringe, or beyond, who isn't a confident reader, and ask them to give you some *honest* feedback on how comfortable they feel in your church's worship and learning, or working groups; then act to improve the situation. (Like asking someone in a wheelchair to do a disabled access survey of your building.)



3. Collectively and individually - put at least as much time, commitment and energy into doing community things in the community as you do into doing churchy things in church.

IN HULL . . . Active Experiences

In Hull, Unlock has specialised in the use of creative visual arts and hands on activities. One of the keys in Hull seems to have been their way of thinking in very concrete terms, which fits well into traditional tabloid culture. In Hull they have – made bricks with no straw – literally; they have conducted an 'exodus' from the safety of the church, into the



'new territory 'of the estate, on gocarts that they had all worked together to build, and they have 'entered the promised land' by placing a big thick curtain across the sanctuary and then pulling it down to reveal a feast of fish and chips, ready to share on the other side

The Power of Stories Stories are Unlock's

Superpower!

How Unlock partnerships with a local church or small group of churches enhance mission and discipleship.





Unlock Local Launch Partnerships Pilots and Pilot Boats

Have you ever been at a port town or city and watched the local Pilot boat guiding big cargo ships in and out of the port at high tide? The Pilot, in the Pilot Boat, knows the local rocks, sandbanks, channels and tides and is able to guide the bigger vessels through them by a safe route. So the Unlock local workers (local people, not external 'experts') are 'Unlock Local Pilots'; who know the ways of the local community, and whose role (trained and supported by Unlock) is to guide the 'Unlock Local Launch' safely to the point where it can voyage onwards on its own.





How Do They Work?

Unlock's National Office provides:

Training, support resources and consultancy for two years; Including: -

- 1 day Unlock training on site (which you can open up to the wider area)
- Unlock staff make 2 further site visits to your Unlock Local Pilot(s) over 24 months
- Free attendance for 2 Unlock Local Pilots at 2 Unlock National Gatherings
- Unlimited remote support, guidance, review, training and consultation
- Unlimited access to Unlock worker resources and training/guidance on the Unlock website
- Funded attendance at The Unlock London walk for 1-2 Unlock local pilot(s) in their first year (as part of their training).



Expected Outcomes

- Growing the congregation's confidence and skills in faith sharing
- Strengthening connections in both church and community
- Nurturing self-esteem and personal growth
- Nurturing indigenous leadership
- Recognising ourselves as part of God's big story

Total cost is £1800 over two years, (most of which is paid monthly – i.e. around £60 per month).

- What works for you works for everyone else.

- Everyone who wants to learn will find a way that suits them.
- It didn't do me any harm, did it?' is actually true!
- If church doesn't do it, it isn't holy.
- If it isn't in a book it doesn't have any authority





Please *don't* assume that . .

People who are not attracted by formal courses are not interested in learning about their faith.
 Those with no qualifications have nothing to teach.

First she looks around for something beautiful, then she keeps looking at it while she says the Lord's Prayer. She says it works - most of the time.



PARTNERSHIPS...

Unlock has a rewarding long-term partnership with The Saltley Trust in Birmingham which funds annual training events at Queen's Foundation





Unlock also connects with the **Urban Theology Union, Urban Expression, Church Urban Fund, CURBS**, the **National Estate Churches Network**, and the **Estates Evangelism Task Group.**



How is Unlock funded?

Unlock is entirely funded on a voluntary basis by people like you who believe in our work.

We rely heavily on our **Annual London walk,** which attracts around 500 people each April, and raises about one third of our annual budget through sponsorship and donations. Other funds are provided by gifts from supporters and Christian charitable trusts.



Unlock would cease to exist without the money raised by the Unlock London walks **Unlock London Walks: -**

- Have been going for 42 years now
 Help people from outside inner London meet with the people and churches ministering there
- Sponsorship & donations from the walk provide the funds for Unlock to operate nationwide.





The COVID Impact on funding

- In 2020 and 2021 we had no choice but to take our Unlock London Walks online and run virtual events.
- Over the two years impacted by COVID our walk income was down by around £15k overall
- We are very thankful that the 2022 walk combined with an appeal has made up what we lost
- We were thrilled and surprised when the 2024 walk raised a staggering £25K
- Now we need ongoing funding to allow us to generate and sustain new work in new places going forward.



The aims of the Unlock London Walk are:-

Primarily to raise money for Unlock's crucial work in deprived urban communities across the UK

And also - to raise awareness of the issues of exclusion that Unlock exists to address, And to showcase the ministry of churches in urban areas – `*Come and see what God is doing in the city'.*





The aims of the Unlock London Walk are:-

- To encourage churches in more affluent parts of the country to support the work of their fellow Christians in the inner city.
- To give 100s of people an opportunity for an unusual and inspiring day out in London in return for their donations to Unlock's work.





REALLY EASY WALK SPONSORSHIP

Thank You!

We need the income from the walk more than ever before

- We are aware of how fortunate we are to have so many deeply committed and faithful supporters but we really need you to keep it up!.
- The 2024 walk raised **£25k.** That was an amazing improvement; Thank you!
- The 2023 walk raised £20k, in 2022 it was £21k, in 2018 it was £26,214 and it was £26,596 in 2015.
- These are all very generous amounts, but lower than 2014 (£29,772).
- We need to keep London Walk income between £25k and £30k to secure Unlock's future.
- Falling income levels would force us to cut back on the frontline work we can deliver.
- Unlock are extremely grateful for the finance that Unlock walkers continue to generate for our frontline work.



Unlock's work is about Christian Mission

It is urgently focussed on bringing *God's Good News* to those who have often been ignored as unimportant, here, on our own doorsteps, in our own UK cities.
