Locations, Questions and Answers (Amplified)

1

Location. On notice board just inside park entrance opposite Erica Street.

Question. About when did the Bishop of London grant the tithes of Wormholt to St Paul's Cathedral School?

Answer. End of the twelfth century.

L. The school is on the south-east corner of the junction with India Way, almost adjacent to the checkpoint church.

Q. What is the motto of St John XXIII Primary School?

A. Obedience & Peace OR Inspiring faith in our future OR
We aim for excellence with God at the centre of all we think, do and say

L. Along the walk in Hammersmith Park between South Africa Road and Japanese Gateway.

Q. What do the Japanese lanterns celebrate?

A. Any words conveying the idea of Japanese Enterprise/Industry/Commerce or Japan in Europe or Hammersmith Park's association with Japan.

L. Outside west entrance to Westfield, next door to Khier.

Q. Name two things you can consume while your bike is being repaired.

A. Any two of Coffee, Pastries, Sandwiches, Bagels, Smoothies, Soup.

L. On building on St Ann's Road at north-east corner of junction with Stoneliegh Place.

Q. How long after Sir Reginald Rowe died was this plaque put up?

A. 42 years (could be 41 or 43)

L. On notice board on west side of Sirdar Road, just to the south of the checkpoint church.

Q. What does the Clement James Centre seek to do?

A. Releasing potential in the community.

6b

L. Treadgold street on north wall of checkpoint church.

Q. Hidden in the St Clement's Anchor are 3 creatures of land, sea and air. Can you spot all three?

A. Cat, fish and bird. (Not clearly a cat, might be another similar looking animal, even a mouse. According to the artist it is a cat, the bird is a dove and the fish is the Christian symbol.)

L. On the tower.

Q. Where is Grenfell forever?

A. Forever in our hearts.

L. Lancaster Road at Museum of Brands.

Q. What's wrong with Persil?

A. It's spelled Pesril.

L. At entrance to Talbot Road from Portobello Road.

Q. What must traffic keep left to avoid just here in Talbot Road? (Same answer as Q16)

A. Historic below ground public toilets.

L. On Talbot Road north side at Powis Square, just to west of Powis Terrace (wrongly labelled Ledbury Road on Ian's map.

Q. How should you know this Arts Centre was once a place of worship?

A. It's called the Tabernacle. (Accept "A place that was a broken church")

L. On house east side of Aldridge Road Villas, a bit south of half way, about by the "E" of Aldridge.

Q. Give the first and last names of the Indian Statesman who lived here.

A. Sardar (Vallabhbhai Javerbhai) Patel. (Strictly, Sardar is a title, so accept Vallabhbhai Patel.)

L. Canal towpath, immediately on east side of spiral bridge to Harrow Road.

Q. On what arm of the Grand Union Canal are we here?

A. Paddington.

L. Signs on two gates to Voysey Garden (i) North-east end, by toilets (ii) midway on east side.

Q. What is special about the under-tens going into Voysey Garden?

A. Must be accompanied by an adult.

L. Corner of Southam Street and Golborne Road, where route makes hairpin bend.

Q. How old was Kelso Cochrane when he was murdered at this spot?

A. 32 (could be 31 or 33)

L. Along Golborne Road.

Q. Name three of the many different nationalities represented by the businesses along Golborne Road.

A. Possibilities include: Portuguese, Argentinian, French, Moroccan, Palestinian or even British.

L. At entrance to Bevington Road from Golborne Road.

Q. What must traffic keep left to avoid at the end of Bevington Road? (Same answer as Q9)

A. Historic below ground public toilets.

- L. Blue plaque on building on west side of Ladbroke Grove, 50 yards north of Chesterton Road (on southwest corner of first junction with St Charles Square/St Michaels Gardens).
- Q. How long did this illustrator of Dickens' novels live here?
- A. 6 years (could be 5 or 7)

18

- L. East end of school building viewed from car park off Scrubs Lane.
- Q. This complete school building was put up and fitted out in a record-breaking nine weeks over the summer of 2017. What is the motto on its eastern end wall?
- A. intrepidus

19

- L. North west corner of stadium wall (below RM of WORMWOOD SCRUBS) i.e. north east corner of car park.
- Q. Which Jamaican born British sprinter is commemorated at this stadium?
- A. Linford Christie

20

- L. On north wall of Wormwood Scrubs Prison, fairly close to west end.
- Q. What should you do if you see someone coming over the wall?
- A. Call 07779 430558

- L. Checkpoint A
- Q. What is the name of the church that hosted the Unlock staff team for the 2009 Unlock London Walk?
- A. St Mathias
