Hackney was almost rural in the 1830s. As late as 1851, Homerton was described as "a retired village." By 1859, two hundred thousand people were crammed into a small borough. In recent decades decline has been rapid, offset by incomers from many countries and many colours and religions. Hackney now is a typical inner-area of Europe's most multi-racial capital.
