

Bits of history----

SOUTHWARK

The George Inn

The one surviving wing remains as it was re-built after the fire in 1876. It is the only galleried inn left in London.

Site of the original St. Thomas Hospital which was one of the first hospitals in the country. One of its later buildings is a surgical ward survives in St Thomas St.

Bankside

In 16th & 17th centuries this was the entertainment centre of London, having many activities banned from the City of London - bull & bear baiting, brothels and the beginning of theatres

The Globe Museum

Well worth a visit! (C&D) It shows the history of "purpose-built Theatre with models of Rose, Swan & Globe. Run by "Friends of the Globe" & proposing to develop alongside the full-scale reconstruction of the "Globe".

"The Clink"

Was the Bishops' Prison during the Reformation. It was originally inside the Palace of the powerful Bishops of Winchester on this site

LAMBETH

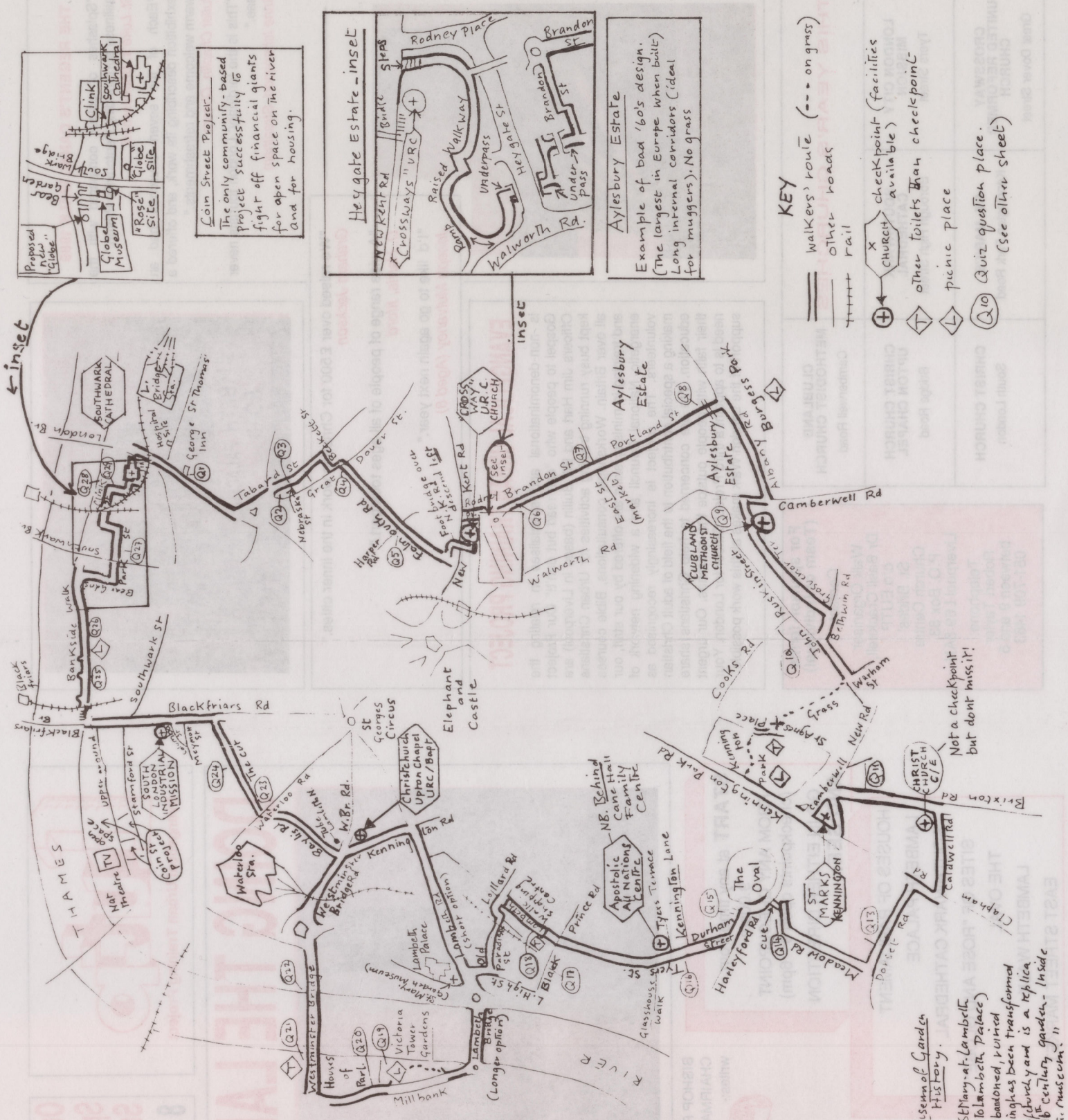
Lambeth Palace

"Londomers & strangers do not usually realise that London possesses in this palace a complex of buildings largely medieval and of greatest interest"

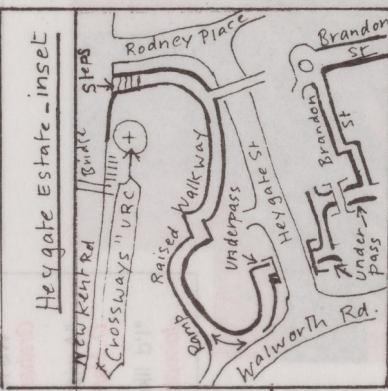
The site has belonged to archbishops since the late 12th century. The hall is one of London's most attractive buildings Nikolaus Pevsner

Museum of Garden History

At St Mary-at-Lambeth (next to Lambeth Palace) an abandoned, ruined building has been transformed into a 16th century garden - inside is the museum.



Coin Street Project
The only community-based project successfully to fight off financial giants for open space on the river and for housing.



Aylesbury Estate
Example of bad '60s design. (The largest in Europe when built) Long internal corridors (ideal for muggers). No grass
