See you on the day!



Go in either direction!

The northern section is between WAPPING and SHADWELL underground stations on the East London Line, linked to ROTHERHITHE station across the river. The 'optional extra' for hardy walkers is an additional 2.2 miles to see Tower Bridge and the St. Katherine's Dock. CHECK POINTS WILL BE OPEN FROM 9am to 6pm.
